Our community of supporters committed more than **\$3 MILLION** through their service, in-kind donations and financial contributions.

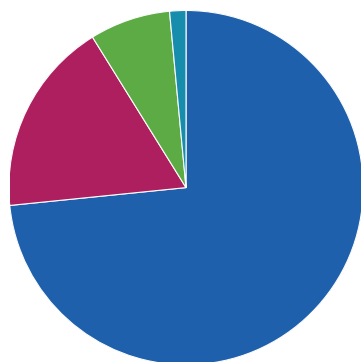


2,596 children and family members worked with Youth In Need to strengthen their families and **PREPARE CHILDREN** for **KINDERGARTEN.**

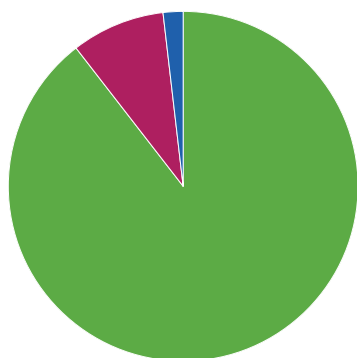
